## SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

## HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Do-  
minion Lands in Manitoba or  
the Northwest Provinces, excepting  
8 and 26, not reserved, may be  
homesteaded by any person who is  
the sole head of a family, or any  
male over 18 years of age, to the  
extent of one-quarter section of 160  
acres, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at  
the local land office for the district  
in which the land is situated, or if the  
homesteader desires, he may, on ap-  
plication to the Minister of the In-  
terior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of  
Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local  
agent receive authority for some one  
to make entry for him.

The homesteader is required to per-  
form the conditions connected there-  
with under one of the following plans:

- (1) At least six months' residence  
upon and cultivation of the land in  
each year for three years.
- (2) If the father (or mother, if the  
father is deceased) of the homestead-  
er resides upon a farm in the vicinity  
of the land entered for the require-  
ments as to residence may be satis-  
fied by such person residing with the  
father or mother.
- (3) If the settler has his permanent  
residence upon farming land owned  
by him in the vicinity of his home-  
stead, the requirements as to resi-  
dence may be satisfied by residence  
upon the said land.

Six months' notice in writing  
should be given to the Commissioner  
of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of in-  
tention to apply for patent.
