Accordingly the House resolved itself into the said Committee.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Bedard took the Chair of the Committee;

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair,

And Mr. Bedard reported, that the Committee had gone through the Bill, and had made an amendment thereto, which he was directed to Report to the House, and he read the Report in his place, and afterwards delivered the same, with the Bill, in at the Table, where it was again read by the Clerk.

On motion of Mr. Taschereau, seconded by Mr. Berthelot,

RESOLVED, That this House doth concur with the Committee in the faid amendment.

ORDERED, That the Bill, as amended, be ingrossed,

On motion of Mr. McGill, seconded by Mr. Martineau,

Ordered, That Mr. McGill have leave to bring in a Bill to provide for the more effectual Regulation of the Police within the Cities of Quehec and Montreal, and Town of Three-Rivers; also for extending Regulations of Police to other Towns and Villages in certain cases; and for repealing the Acts or Ordinances therein mentioned.

He accordingly presented the said Bill to the House, and the same was received and read for the first time.

RESOLVED, That the faid Bill be read a second time on Monday next.
