which ended on the 5th January, 1812, and for the year which will end on the 5th January next, for the information of this House; and that a similar statement of the Expences of the Collection of the Revenues of the Crown do annually accompany the Accounts of the Provincial Revenues of the Crown.

ORDERED, that Mr. Taschereau, Mr. Bruneau, Mr. Bellet, Mr. Denechau, Mr. Gauvreau, Mr. Stuart, Mr. Borgia, and Mr. Mure, do present the said Address to His Excellency the Governor in Chief.

Mr. Speaker acquainted the House he had received a letter from Mr. Lindsay, the Clerk, the which he would read for the information of the House.

The said Letter is as followeth, viz.

Clerk's Office, House of Assembly, Quebec, 30th December, 1812.

SIR.

I request permission through you to acquaint the Honourable House of Assembly, that as the Office of English Translator and Ingresser is vacant, I humbly recommend William Green. Esquire, Clerk of the Peace, to fill up the place; and as Mr. Frémont, the French-Translator, is absent on service, in order that the public ousiness may not be delayed. I have engaged Mr. Jean Antoine Boutbillier, in the mean time, to translate into French; and for the duties he may perform, he will look to the House for such remuneration, as in its wisdom it may judge sufficient.
