BERLIN, April 9-At this morning's session of the Soviet Congress, the Independent Socialists presented two resolutions extending greetings to the Bavarian and Hungarian Soviet republics. There was a lively discussion especially regarding Ba-varia. The Independent Socialists wanted the congress to express a hope that the Bavarian proletariat might overcome op position and that the rest of Germany may follow its example The motion was postponed after an unfavorable discu the greeting to Hungary was accepted in spite of recent threat-ening predictions. 


