## Sergt. Dean White

The following from the Summer-side Pioneer refers to a brave son of a former Rector at Kentville:

"An exceptionally large number of friends and acquaintances have been deeply grieved to learn that Sergt. Deane White, eldest son of Rev. C. De Wolfe and Mrs. White, of Summerside was killed in action in France on Sept. 2nd. This brave Summer-side boy was not yet eighteen years of age when, at the beginning of the war, he volunteered for active service and succeeded in enlisting for garrison duty at Halifax. When the 105th Battalion was recruited he joined that regiment and was one of the most popular and enthusiastic of them all. He went with them Overseas and was transferred in England with an early draft of reinforcements to the Fighting 26th, which has recently suffered so many casualties and possibly seen more fighting than any other Canadian regiment. In the bright future that has been so heroically cut off, his bereaved parents and relatives have the deep sympathy of the community and the consolation that he did his full duty and his bit. Of a family of ten brothers and sisters who are left to mourn only one other is yet of military age and he, Cadet Ross White, is now in training at Toronto with the Royal Air Force."
