Workmen's Compensation. The new Workmen's Compensation Act came into force on Monday, July

Act came into force on Monday, July 1st.

Roughly speaking, every person employed in manual labor, all domestic servants and persons employed otherwise than in manual labor whose remuneration does not exceed \$1,250, come within the act. For all accidents to these employers are liable. The compensation for partial or total incapacitation cannot exceed \$5 a week. Subject to that limitation, the basis of compensation will be 50 per cent. of the average week earnings. So long as an employe is incapacitated the payment goes on though it may be renewed by the purchase of an annuity equal to 75 per cent. of the armual value of the weekly payment. When death results from an injury the maximum compensation is fixed at \$1,500 and the minimum at \$750.


