'T WAS A GRAND GATHERING

Chatham Delegates Speak Enthusiastically of the Whitney Conference

Spirit of Victory was in the Air—Parties Uniting for Good Clean Government.

The delegates from Chatham who attended the magnificent Liberal-Conservative conference held by Mr. Whitney in Toronto, came back with glowing accounts of a profitable and encouraging meeting. Mr. Whitney has the people with him in this election and the conference was one of the largest and most enthusiastic meetings ever held in Toronto. The people are wide awake to the duties that are before them and indications point to a grand victory for Whitney and good, clean, honest Government.

Among the delegates from Chatham who have just returned are James Clancy, Herbert S. Clements, M. P., S. B. Arnold, Dr. Hall, Dr. Thornton and Geo. Gant, and everyone of them is delighted with the splendid conference.

Mr. Arnold said—The thing that struck me most forcibly was that the Ontario Conservatives have got a party leader of whom they may well be proud. Any man who sat and listened to the speech made by Mr. Whitney would never fear his ability as a leader. There is no possible danger of the province suffering in the hands of such a man as Mr. Whitney proved himself to be. I was thoroughly enthused and delighted with the whole conference.

Geo. Gant, who was also present, said—It was one of the best conventions ever held in Toronto. I was surprised to see such a large gathering, and I had looked for a pretty big one. Mr. Whitney is one of the most finished speakers I ever heard and he certainly is a man whom the people of the province can trust. He speaks openly and straightforwardly and is convincing in his arguments.

Dr. Hall was very enthusiastic over the conference. "It was a very enthusiastic meeting," said he, "and was especially characterized by the unanimity of opinion by the speakers and delegates. The speaking was of a very high character, and Whitney was certainly endorsed by his followers. The hall was too small to accommodate the people who were there with the purpose of attending, and hundreds were turned away on the afternoon of the first day. The conference was greatly beneficial, and it enabled the party to get together and get to understand the issues which will come before the people."

If the opposition want a platform they can find an excellent one in Mr. Whitney's speech. It is large enough for both parties to stand on and they will both look for a long time before they find another as good."

Mr. Clancy, H. S. Clements and Dr. Thornton were also very enthusiastic over the result of the conference and spoke encouragingly of the coming contest. There seems to be no ground to doubt that Whitney will win.

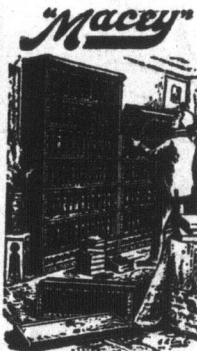
