### ENGLISH-SPEAKING CANADA VOTED CONSERVATIVE

Outside of Quebec Province the total Dominion vote for the Conservatives in the last election exceeded the total vote outside of that Province for the Liberals by 69,092 votes, and exceeded the total vote cast for the Progressives in all Canada by 38,372 votes. The total vote cast in the Canadian constituencies outside of Quebec was as follows:

For Conservatives ..... 807,759  
For Liberals ..... 738,667  
For Progressives ..... 737,589

So the Liberals got the smallest part of the vote in English-speaking Canada and the Conservatives got the largest part.

#### HOLIDAYS FOR 1922

With the year 1921 finished queries are already being made regarding the holidays and holy days for 1922. New Year's Day, of course, began the year's festivities. Ash Wednesday will be March 1; Palm Sunday, April 9; Good Friday, April 14; and Easter Sunday, April 16. This is later than usual. Last year Easter Sunday was March 27. Victoria Day will be Wednesday, May 24th. The King's birthday, June 3, will be on Sunday. Dominion Day will be on Saturday, July 1. Labor Day will be Monday, September 4. Thanks giving Day, if the arrangement is the same as it was last year, will be on Monday Nov. 6. The anniversary of Armistice Day will be on Sunday, November 11.
