

Improve the Streets

Mr. Editor: It will soon be time

in the hands of a competent roadmaker who would have gravel hauled from the shore of the river, placed properly on the roadway and rolled in, we would have in the course of a year or two a highway that would not only be clean, but solid. The roadway should be rounded to both sides so as to carry the water to gutters at the edges of the sidewalks, which could easily be made with cobblestones. A little care in the construction of these would cause the water to flow to points where it would find its way to the river.

There again, a certain portion of the sidewalks should be treated each year with a coating of asphalt or cement until the portions of the village where there is the most traffic would have clean, dry walks. Main street from Maple


