CONTRACT FOR OATS.

THE Deputy Commissary General will receive sealed tenders, in duplicate, to be marked on the envelope "Tenders for Oats," at this Office, until 12 o'clock, on SATURDAY, the 2d of July next, for the supply of such quantities of OATS as may be required for Her Majesty's Service in the West India Command during the year, from the 1st April, 1852, to 31st March, 1853, inclusive.

The estimated quantities required monthly for the Service of each Station, are as follows, but more or less may be called for according to the requirements of the Service:

The Oats to be of the best quality, perfectly free from stones, dirt, weevil, &c., the growth either of the United States or British North America. The Oats are to be delivered every two months into the Commissariat Magazines of each Station, at the discretion of the Deputy Commissary General, upon the requisition of the Station Resident Commissariat Officer, and will be subject to the approval of a Board of Officers. Offers may be sent in for each Station separately, or for the whole Command collectively, at the option of the Tenderer, and each tender must express the rate per 100 lbs. net weight, in figures and in words at length, at which it is proposed to supply the article, stipulating whether the Oats are to be the produce of British North America, or the United States. The Tenderer must be accompanied by a letter signed by two persons of known property, engaging to become bound with the party tendering, in a sum not exceeding one third of the value of the estimated quantity of Oats to be delivered during the term of the Contract. The packages containing the Oats will be returned to the Contractor on the occasion of each delivery.
