"THE HEMLOCK MUST BE DRUNK."

As the moment approaches for final action by the House of Lords on the veto bill there is a marked change of attitude on the part of the militant wing of the Tory party. It is quite evident that the party managers and organizers have been carefully inquiring into the condition of public opinion and the probable result of another general election in the event of the King refusing to create enough new Peers to put the veto bill through the Lords...

The veto bill will therefore be accepted by the Lords "under duress." The Daily Telegraph, owned by Lord Northcliffe, says "the hemlock must be drunk," but, forgetting that in Greece he who would drink the hemlock was performing his last conscious act on earth, adds that "what is done will not be irrevocable." There is to be some sort of political stomach pump at hand to save the Lords from the consequences of drinking the hemlock...

Liberals can afford to smile at these speculations. They are of a piece with the statements made by the Peers and their supporters among the House of Commons when the general election of January, 1910, proved that

the country favored Lloyd-George's land taxation Budget. The Lords accepted the principle of the taxation of the unearned increment of land "under duress" as they now propose to accept the veto bill, but in the short space of eighteen months that principle has so proved its value by the breaking up of great estates that no political party ever likely to hold power in the United Kingdom would dare to repeal the land taxation clauses...

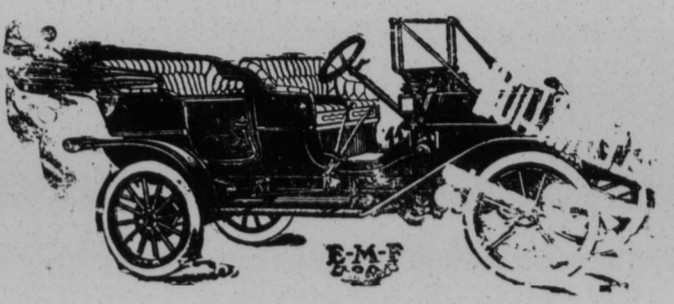

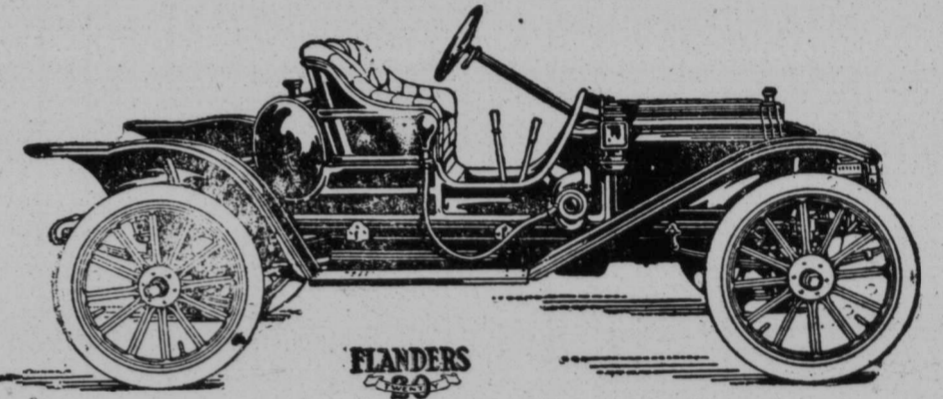

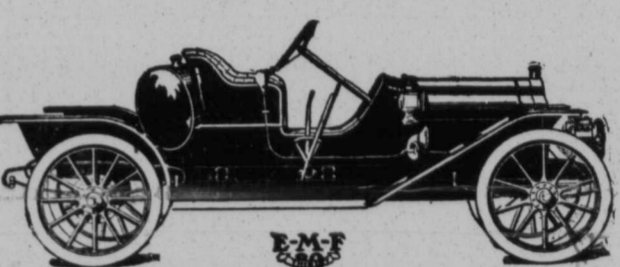
