Sentenced to Death.

End of Sensational Trial of Stinie Morrison in London.

London, March 19.—Stinie Morrison today was found guilty of the murder of Joseph Heron and sentenced to death. The police tried to connect the tragedy with the Houndsditch anarchist burglar gang and the trial was one of the most sensational and longest drawn-out that has been held in London.

The body of Heron was found on Clapham common in January. The police theory was that the victim was a member of the Houndsditch crowd and had been killed for treachery by his associates. The trial occupied nine days. The evidence was wholly circumstantial. Morrison who is a Russian Jew claimed that he spent the evening of the murder at a music hall and the rest of the night at his home. Most of the witnesses were from the Whitechapel district and startling assertions were made on both

sides. A sensation was caused this afternoon when the closing arguments of counsel were interrupted to admit the testimony of a policeman who declared that his colleague had sworn falsely.

Morrison gave many incriminating admissions and, under cross examination, admitted that he had been several times convicted of burglary.

Three Die to Hide Offense.

Coroner Finds Mrs. Wood Killed Husband, Son and Self, Fearing Exposure After Using Funds.

New Haven, Conn., March 17.—That Mrs. Christopher G. Wood shot and killed her husband at their home in Branford, on March 8, their ten year old son, Valdemar, on the day following, and then inflicted fatal wounds upon herself, was the finding of Coroner Eli Hill, made public Tuesday.

In his report the coroner found that on the day before his death Wood learned that his wife was indebted in large amounts for dry goods and other purchases. He rebuked her, and next day discovered that large sums deposited by him in several banks had been drawn by his wife upon orders purporting to be signed by him. Mrs. Wood, the report states, fearing exposure, or that criminal proceedings might result, killed her husband, her son and herself.

Magistrate Benning sent a message to the Health Authorities recently saying that there was one case of small pox at St. Lawrence—a man who returned from Sydney a few days ago. Dr. Shilth was ordered to proceed there from Burin to attend the patient. The house has been quarantined and it is believed that there will be no more cases there.
