From Mr. John Bailey, of Bannernan Street, Mr. Bearns' principal assistant, the Telegram obtained the particulars of how the conflagration originated. Mr. Bailey opened the store as usual at 8 a.m. to-day and enered the place with Mr. F. Garland carpenter, who is erecting a new ofice on the second flat with Mr. Lilly. 
