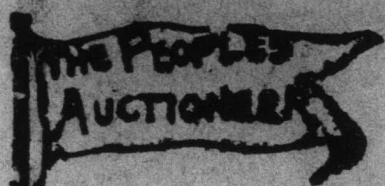

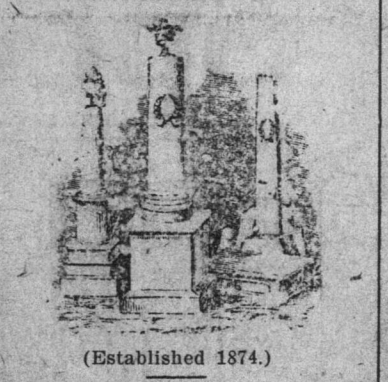

### NOTICE! Recruits are Wanted for the Newfoundland Royal Naval Reserve.

The attention of all young men of  
18 years and over is called to the  
advantages of the Reserve.  
Directly on joining, pay commences  
at the rate of 1/8 English Money, or  
40 cents in Newfoundland Currency,  
per day, and in addition there is a  
War Retainer Allowance of 16 cents a  
day, which is saved up for each Re-  
cruit. An entirely free kit of clothes  
is provided—the Food is of first-class  
quality and the allowance is a good  
and full one.

If a man allots 5/0, or \$1.21 a week  
to his Father or Mother, or to any  
Relative or even to a friend, a similar  
sum of 5/0 is added to this amount as  
Separation Allowance from the Ad-  
miralty. If he allots 6/0, or \$1.46 a  
week, the Separation Allowance is  
similarly \$1.46, but this is the high-  
est for a Single man.

The wife, in the case of Married  
men who allot not less than 5/0 a  
week, receives 6/0 Separation Allow-  
ance, and where there are children  
the following scale of Separation Al-  
lowance is paid:—

Wife and 1 child—	12/0 a week, or . . . . . \$2.92
Wife and 2 children—	16/6 a week, or . . . . . \$4.01
Wife and 3 children—	20/0 a week, or . . . . . \$4.88
Wife and 4 children—	22/0 a week, or . . . . . \$5.34
and 2/0 each for every additional child.	

This is in addition to the 5/0 or more  
per week allotted by the husband.  
In the case of a Motherless child  
an allowance of 5/0 per week, or \$1.21,  
is made to the Guardian, and in the  
event of a Mother dying while her  
husband is serving, this allowance  
becomes payable for each child.

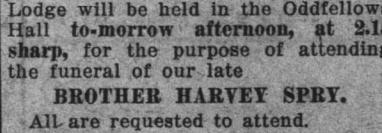
