The Issue in Canada



Many eyes are turned to day towards Canada in the crisis that has come upon her. It is difficult to predict how she will emerge from

it. If her newspapers provide any criterion, there is not another country in world so cursed with politics. Hardly a question of public importance ever seems there to be discussed and settled on its own merits, but rather upon those of its champions and opponents and their political and personal records. The Government is proceeding perforce warily and without precipitation. The Conscription and Extension of Parlia ment measures are being framed carefully and have not yet been presented before the House. It is a pity that they do not come from a source which would have a better claim and be a better warrant for their immediate and whole-hearted acceptance. The Borden Government has not conmanner calculated to compel unqualified admiration, and from one cause or another the tide seems to be setting in strongly against it. The difficulties are very great at this time in the way of the formation of a coalition ministry, but that may well be the result of the struggle that is beginning.
