Sudden Death.

EX-COUNCILLOR COLLAPSES IN SHOP.

Mr. S. H. Peet, the well known blacksmith and ex-Councillor, died suddenly in the workshop of Messrs. T. J. Duley, Ltd. yesterday afternoon. The deceased had been in the shop chatting to Mr. Geo. Dwyer, after he had completed his work, when without any warning, he collapsed. Medical assistance was quickly summoned, but when the doctors arrived, Mr. Peet was beyond all human aid. Death was due to heart failure.

Son of the late William Peet of Nottingham, England, deceased was born in St. John's in 1854. He followed the trade of blacksmith and after serving his time, formed a partnership with Mr. Joseph Miller. After the fire he built his own shop on George St., which he shortly turned into a lucrative business. He was actively interested in matters affecting the welfare of the community, and during his two years of service in the Civil Commission, rendered valuable assistance. An active member of the L. O. A., he was a Past Master of Leeming Lodge and had held various other offices. He was also a member of the Masonic Fraternity and the Conception Bay British Society. He leaves to mourn him, a widow, formerly Miss Christina Clifford, daughter of the late James Clifford, five sons, Messrs. William J. and Charles of Ayre & Sons, Chesley at F. Smallwood's, Albert, an employee of the Reid N. Co., and Ernest, now at Alberta, Western Canada; also two daughters, Mrs. H. B. Butler, of Chicago, and Mrs. Maud Griegnon, of Boston. District Inspector Peet of Curling is a brother, and another brother, Mr. William Peet, of Lansing, Mich., also survives. An only sister, Mrs. Thos. Walsh, of Springdale, N. D. B., is also left to mourn. For the sorrowing family there is widespread sympathy in their sudden bereavement. The funeral takes place tomorrow afternoon from his late residence, Brazil's Square.

S. S. Home Reaches Bonne Esperance.

The S.S. Home reached Curling at 4.35 p.m. on Sunday from her first trip to the Straits of Belle Isle for this season, says the Western Star of 7th inst. She reached Bonne Esperance and reports the Straits full of ice. The Home left Curling last Tuesday midnight and made all her ports of call along the Newfoundland coast. At Flower's Cove she found it impossible to cross the Straits owing to the field of ice, so she came back as far as Port aux Choix and went across from there to Labrador Coast south of the ice field. Here she landed Whiteley and crew. The ice extended right across the Straits and was packed so closely to the land that the ship was unable to proceed further north. She brought along a few passengers and a big mail.

Aged Man Found Dead.

A message was received yesterday afternoon by the Deputy Minister of Justice from Magistrate Sullivan of Balne Harbour containing the following sad intelligence:—"Anthony Hayes, aged 80, was found dead at the foot of a cliff at Parker's Cove. An inquiry will be held."
