

The Vicar of all the establishments of the Sacred Heart in Canada, Mother Marie Therese Francais, died at Sault au Recollet on Friday last.

A number of counterfeit bills on Canadian Banks have been put in circulation in Toronto. They are chiefly "ones" altered to represent bills of a larger denomination. They are easily detected.

Some time ago Mr. Wynn, mail agent, sustained very serious injuries by an accident on the Great-Western Railway. The New York Times says: Speculators have striven to control enormous supplies in order to force high prices upon the market, and they have been aided by the banks, whose returns exhibit an amount of overtrading which is little less than criminal. The result is that the banks themselves are weakened to a degree which in specie-paying times, would be pregnant with peril; that speculation of all kinds has attained enormous proportions, and that merchants and manufacturers are denied accommodation at a period when its enlargement is imperatively required. The spectacle is, indeed, presented of a refusal to satisfy the bona fide wants of trade concurrently with the making of loans to sustain gambling of the most injurious character. The best interests of the community are made to suffer the penalty of sins committed by bank managers, acting in collusion with speculators. For the injury thus inflicted upon their most meritorious customers, and through them upon the country, the monetary institution of this city are largely responsible.
