Continuing his address in regard to 'Education," he said that every successful nation has been built up by educated people, therefore, parents should educate their children so that they will be able to express themselves intelligently, upbuild the race, meet the need of the time, and be able to read and understand the history o ftheir ancestors. That is why some of our people do not like to be called "Negroes" is because they are ignorant of the history of their

It was an African who gave mathematics to the world; but because of the fact, the white people have called it Geometry, because they did not want to call it the Negro Man's name. When you speak of Science, you have to come back to the Negro.

As to Religion, the Association does not interfere with the Churches. We have been living under a wrong psycology. We have been taught that the white fellow is our superior. hence, even at school, our children see the difference; and until we get away from such silly ideas and realise that all men have certain equality, we will not be able to reach that stage of progress.

Socialism is one of the greatest powers of the day, said Sir Richard Toby. The Negro boys should stop marrying white girls, for while the white boy has only one kind to select his bride from the Negro has from a high yellow down to the cinnamon to choose from.

When you talk about Commercialism, Negroes laugh you to scorn. You have heard of men like Columbus discovering America; but thousands of years before America was discovered, Negroes had come to America and introduced such articles as the pampam belts, peanuts, etc. They were called Phoenicians, and the Phoenicians were black people, who traded with different parts of the world.

By all means take an interest in this Association and become a member, for if it meets with success, it means success for every Negro; and if it goes down, then every Negro goes with it, for the whites look on all Negroes as members of the said Association, whether you are one or not.
