Engineering, referring to a recent gerernment report, says that the thrift of the working classes is reflected in the development of co-operative effort, both in distribution and production, also of profit sharing concerns. It is in the distributive section that most progress has been made, but the productive side is advancing by rapid strides. Building societies and loan societies are also suggestive of thrift; the former are notable for the acquisition of dwelling houses by the artisan and small trader—perhaps more to the latter's advantage than to the workman's. The friendly society was the parent of all these associations for thrift. It is still far ahead of all others, and it is growing. The accumulated funds of all friendly societies increased from 5,288,833 to 6,551,287 and the funds from \$4,492,307 to \$6,551,287 and the funds greater special solecties also increased in the same period. Tables are given of the chief orders and larger societies. The aggregate number of societies making returns was 29,414; the total membership was 13,334,494; the aggregate funds \$44,848,575. With these figures before us, adds Engineering, we cannot rightly accuse the masses of want of thrift. That a large proportion are thriftless is certain, but with nearly 13½ millions of members in those societies alone, the population, as a whole, is well represented. This is exclusive of trade unions, provident societies, building societies, and other forms of local and general associations.
