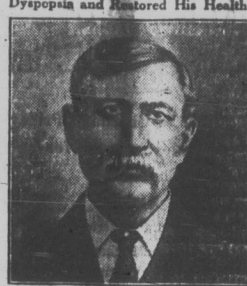

MAY BE ABSENT FOR SIX WEEKS

Session May be Over Before Mr. Currie is Better.

FREDERICTON, Mar. 7.—Unless the present session of the Legislature proves to be a very long one, ex-Speaker Wm. Currie may not be here before the House is prorogued. That it will be at least six weeks before Mr. Currie is able to come to Fredericton and take his place in the legislature is the opinion expressed by Mr. LeBlanc, his colleague from Restigouche.

Mr. LeBlanc recently visited the ex-Speaker at the Moncton Hospital, where he was operated upon several weeks ago and he declares that Mr. Currie's condition was such as to make it appear likely that he would be at least six weeks before he would be able to come here and take up vigorous work which a resumption of his seat in the House under the circumstances would entail. "Mr. Currie expected to be out of the hospital in ten days' time," said Mr. LeBlanc. "But I don't believe he realized the seriousness of his condition. He has been suffering much pain, and had to undergo very delicate treatment and admitted to me that he thought it was done for a few days ago. However, he is now getting better, but not as rapidly as he seems to think."

PROUD RECORD OF BONAVENTURE BOYS

Three Boys Who Have Won Distinction on the Field of Battle.

Pte. Jas. McDavid enlisted in Nov. 1914 in the famous 26th Battalion and saw four years of service. He was twice wounded, first at the battle of the Somme and was invalided to England. When sufficiently recovered to again go to the trenches he was only five months at the front when he was wounded again. When he recovered from his second wound he qualified as drill sergeant and had the pleasure of drilling some of his former companions from Canada.

For his coolness and bravery under very trying circumstances he was recommended for the D.C.M., and a Lieutenantcy. His many friends trust it is not too late yet for his work at the front to be rewarded.

But "Jim" did not return to Canada alone. Over a year ago he was married to Miss Shearman the nurse who attended him both times he was wounded.

Pte. Earl McLeod enlisted at Campbellton on Oct. 19, 1916 in the 23rd Battalion, better known as the MacLean Rifle Battalion after training in Fredericton and Valcartier he went overseas with his battalion in October 1917.

While in England he was drafted into the 72nd Seaforth Highlanders and went to France with that battalion the first of March 1918.

He was in the trenches until the 11th of August when he was wounded in the battle of Amiens.

For his work in a bombing raid in this battle he was recommended along with three of his companions for the Military Medal. He was in a convalescent home in England when peace was declared and sailed from Southampton on January 11th for his home in Canada.

Pte. Thos. MacCallum enlisted in November in what came afterwards to be called the Fighting 26th and saw four years of service. He spent nearly three years at the front before he was wounded although previously he had some very narrow escapes.

He was in England in a convalescent home when peace was declared. On more than one occasion "Tom" showed the same spirit as his ancestors did in wars of long ago and returned decorated with the Military Medal.

Pte. Frank McCallum, a brother of Pte. Thos. MacCallum, enlisted with the 23rd Seaforth Highlanders in Vancouver in 1916 and served fourteen months in France. He is now in England and expects to return to Canada shortly. He also has been awarded the Military Medal. They are brothers of John and Donald MacCallum of the C. G. Rye, of Campbellton and sons of Mr. Wm. MacCallum of Matapedia, Que.
