LARGE CONGREGATIONS AT EASTER SERVICES

Resurrection Day Marked by Special Services in Churches of City; Reception of New Communicants in Anglican and Roman Catholic Churches Feature

Under a glorious sun that subdued the bitterness of still icy winds from the north, London yesterday turned out by thousands for beautiful services in city churches that marked the anniversary of the resurrection. No church was too small to join in the triumphant paean of reborn hopes, nor none too large for full observance of the mystic appeal of the day.

In many churches the day was marked by reception of new communicants. In the Roman and Anglican Catholic churches large classes, confirmed in the final week of Lent, were admitted for the first time to holy communion.

Every church responded to the renaissance sentiment of Easter by elaborately beautiful floral decorations. St. Peter's Cathedral was wonderfully beautiful with masses of lilacs, which with the white and gold radiance of angel wings in the candle-lit religious twilight.

St. Paul's choir bloomed with a wealth of flowers appropriate to the season, and in all churches, whatever the creed, the great lesson of the spiritual rebirth was taught in the massed loveliness of perfect blooms.

Easter music was featured in all churches. Selections from the great masterpieces of religious harmony vied with the simple but loved songs which tell of the great love of God towards fallen man.

Anglican... Easter services in the Anglican church in London were marked by the attendance of exceptionally large congregations. In some instances more than nine hundred records were broken in the number of parishioners who participated in the morning and evening services.

GODERICH MAN TAKEN BY DEATH... Major Isaac Hetherington Dies in Byron Military Hospital

Major Isaac Hetherington, of Goderich, died on Saturday evening in Byron Military Hospital. He had been a patient at the hospital since last October and death was due to tubercular meningitis, which was caused through war service.

When the war broke out the late Mr. Hetherington joined the 151st Battalion, with the rank of major in England his battalion broke up and in order to get to France he served with the 17th Battalion, Winnipeg, Battalion. He served in France nine months and was wounded at the battle of Vimy. For his distinguished work in this battle he was decorated with the Military Cross. While in France he was raised to the rank of captain.

At the close of the war he returned to Canada and was made commander of "A" Company of the 32nd Borneo Regiment, with the rank of major. He was a P. D. G. M. of the Masonic Order, being one of the most prominent Masons of Huron County. He was also a past grand master of Morning Star Lodge, Goderich.

He will be buried with military honors at Goderich. Services will be held in Victoria Street Methodist Church and interment will be made in Colborne Cemetery. Rev. J. W. Hedley will conduct the service.

Resides his widow he is survived by three children.

MANY CHIMNEY FIRES IN LONDON SINCE FRIDAY... City Firemen Called to Seven Such Affairs in Three Days.

Since Good Friday London has been visited by a small epidemic of chimney fires, city firemen having been called to extinguish seven such blazes in the past three days. On Friday the department responded to three alarms caused by fires in chimneys, on Saturday there were two more and the remaining alarms were turned in yesterday.

Though chimney fires are as a general rule not serious, sufficient apparatus is always sent to cope with any eventualities that may develop. This added precaution has been taken in each case since the Thomas Alway Orphan Home was partially destroyed by a fire some weeks ago. This blaze originated in the chimneys on the building.

Fires in chimneys are caused from the collection of soot in the flue, in the majority of cases residents neglecting the burning of soft coal, occasioned by the shortage of anthracite, soot collecting more quickly from the former fuel than was hard coal is used. No damage resulted from any of the fires reported since Friday.
