ST. JOHN'S.—The Woman's Association gave a complimentary "At Home" to the members of the congregation on the evening of Thanksgiving Day. A large number availed themselves of the opportunity of attending and a most enjoyable time was passed.

Miss Leslie, a mission woman from Foo-chow, China, addressed the children of the Sunday-school on Sunday afternoon, and a most interesting description was given of the work done in China.

The Rev. J. Fisher, of Roslin, preached at the evening service in St. John's Church, Sunday, Nov. 29th. His Lordship the Bishop assisted in the service.

The offertory on Advent Sunday was devoted to the Diocesan Mission Fund, and was double that of the previous year.

A very successful week of mission services was held during November at Anglesea Square Mission, conducted by Rev. F. Smith, of Hull. The people attended very well, and the invitation to the workmen to come in their working clothes certainly had the desired effect.

ST. GEORGE'S.—A well-attended missionary meeting was held in the schoolroom, Friday evening, Nov. 27th, at which the Bishop presided. A most interesting address was delivered by Miss Leslie upon the mission work in which she has been engaged for some years past in Foo-chow, China. Her remarks were rendered still more impressive by a display of several curious works of art which she had procured during her work among the Chinese. She gave also a thrilling description of the riots which broke out a short time ago, culminating in the murder of missionaries and pillaging of mission stations.

GRACE CHURCH.—The Lord Bishop of Ottawa preached upon the subject of Advent

at the morning service upon Advent Sunday. A large congregation listened with devout attention to the Bishop's solemn words.

Service was held on Thanksgiving Day at 11 am., and the offertory was presented to the Children's Hospital.

Miss Rose gave a missionary address to the children of the Missionary Guild, Saturday morning, Nov. 28th. There were twenty-six children present at the meeting, all busily engaged with needle and thread as Miss Rose spoke to them of the work of missions in India. Miss Rose showed a number of articles of wearing apparel used by the women of India, and small brass idols which the natives worshipped. The children were deeply interested in the account given by Miss Rose.

Mrs. Crombie, president of the Women's Guild of Grace Church, returned from England, Nov. 29th. The Guild will be very glad to see their president once again, and anticipate that a vigorous winter's work will now be inaugurated under her direction.

The performance of Ben Hur, under the auspices of the Women's Guild, proved a great success. Too much credit cannot be given Mrs. G. E. Perley, to whose untiring efforts the success of the affair was mainly due. Miss Armstrong's services as pianist deserve recognition also. A handsome sum has been handed over to the churchwardens as the result.
