Disarmament Fund Criteria (As of March 29, 1985)

Contributions Component **A**. Recipients of contributions from this fund may be any nongovernment organization, formal or informal academic or public interest group or individual engaged in balanced discussions, research, dissemination of information or publication of information material on the subject of disarmament and arms control or in focusing on disarmament issues as part of an overall programme. The Disarmament Fund will assist in defraying the costs of a project only if it can be determined that it will promote a balanced discussion of arms control and disarmament issues.

Items susceptible to funding include the following:

Conferences/Seminars

8

Certain expenses involved in organizing conferences or seminars in Canada directly related to arms control and disarmament issues.

Travel expenses for a limited number of out-of-town speakers, resource persons or, in exceptional cases, others attending conferences or seminars.

Publications

The Disarmament Fund is prepared to fund the publication of balanced information material, periodicals, or the collection of books and films by groups or organizations that will be consulted by the general public and used as reference material. A complete list of materials to be published or purchased must be submitted in detail (i.e., title, publication, printing costs) at the time of the request. Included in this category, for example, might be the publication of proceedings of conferences or seminars. Requests for assistance in the publication of proceedings are considered only following a conference.

Equipment

Requests for capital purchases of equipment may be considered on a case-by-case basis but only in exceptional circumstances.

Education

Funding will be considered only for proposals of an educational nature that involve scientifically sound research projects which would further the knowledge of arms control and disarmament issues in Canada and which may be of
