PAWLEY: Well, I think it is. I see no reason that the fact that we have 75 percent of our trade is now free and if we up that to 85 percent it will not in my view impact us politically or any other way. Now additional investment and takeover of Canadian operations in Canada might very well have that effect and that's why Canadianization is very, very important, but not additional trade.

GRAY: Aren't you flying in the face ...

PAWLEY: Otherwise we will be afraid to trade with China and the Soviet Union and Latin America and a whole lot of countries.

GRAY: Aren't you flying in the face of federal NDP policy here?

PAWLEY: What I am doing here is endorsing what I believe to be a long time... I was just asked for a copy of the Regina manifesto because I know that the CCF throughout its years in Western Canada, tariff walls were certainly one of the basic areas of disagreement with the CCF movement, the western agrarian movements, the left in western Canada and I don't know whether that's not been the case in Ontario as well.
