PRAYERS.

Mr. Gordon, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, —Copy of Order in Council passed under the provisions of The Relief Act, 1932, as follows:—

Order in Council, P.C. 1172, dated May 18, 1932: authorizing payment to the Province of Saskatchewan of \$1,500,000 for credit of the Saskatchewan Relief Commission to be used for relieving distress and providing employment in the drought stricken areas of Saskatchewan.

Mr. Duranleau, by leave of the House, introduced a Bill, No. 98, An Act to amend The Montreal Harbour Commissioners' Act, 1894, which was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

By unanimous consent, Mr. Gordon moved,—That the House do go into Committee of the Whole forthwith, on a certain proposed Resolution to amend the Soldier Settlement Act.

Whereupon, Mr. Gordon, a Member of the King's Privy Council, informed the House, That His Excellency the Governor General having been informed of the subject-matter of the proposed Resolution, recommends it to the House.

And the question being put on the said motion; it was agreed to.

The House accordingly resolved itself into Committee of the Whole on the said proposed Resolution.

(In the Committee)

The following Resolution was adopted:—

Resolved, That the Soldier Settlement Act be amended to provide for the transfer to the province or municipality of any land which for two years preceding such transfer has not been the subject of a contract of sale; to authorize the
