

On February 27, 1961, as will be found at page 2442 of *Hansard*, Mr. Speaker Michener also stated that it was for the House to determine whether such a Motion for the Production of Papers should be withdrawn or whether it should be passed. Basing my action on those precedents, I propose to put the motion and allow the House to make a decision in regard to the production of the paper unless such a motion is either withdrawn, allowed to stand or transferred for debate.

And the question being put on the said motion, it was ordered,—That there be laid before this House a list of 'consultants' prepared in the office of the Postmaster General for the guidance of Cabinet Ministers and copies of all correspondence between the Ministers of the Crown and the 'consultants' in each riding.—(*Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 99*).

On motion of Mr. Howard, seconded by Mr. Herridge, it was ordered,—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency praying that he will cause to be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence, telegrams or other documents exchanged between the government and any agency or branch thereof and any other government, organization or person since January 1, 1962, dealing with the proposal that another or second Trans-Canada Highway be built.—(*Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 100*).

On motion of Mr. Knowles, seconded by Mr. Howard, it was ordered,—That there be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence exchanged between the Winnipeg School Division No. 1 and the Minister of National Health and Welfare, dated since April 22, 1963, concerning the subject of tobacco advertising on radio and television.—(*Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 103*).

By unanimous consent, the hour for Private Members' Business was set aside for this day's sitting.

The Order being read for the second reading of Bill C-95, An Act to amend the Income Tax Act;

Mr. Gordon, seconded by Mr. Pickersgill, moved,—That the said bill be now read a second time.

And debate arising thereon and continuing;

A Message was received from the Honourable Robert Taschereau, Chief Justice of Canada, in his capacity as Deputy of His Excellency the Governor General, desiring the immediate attendance of the House in the Senate Chamber.

Accordingly, Mr. Speaker, with the House, went to the Senate Chamber.

And being returned;

Mr. Speaker reported that, when the House did attend the Honourable the Deputy of His Excellency the Governor General in the Senate Chamber,
