Heine Zimmerman of Chicago, who led the league in batting last year, with an average of .372, is fourteenth on this year's list, with a mark of .312. The champion Giants got but one regular. Meyers, with .312 in the select 300 class, altho Arthur Fletcher was close to the mark, with .297. The veteran Honus Wagner put to his credit the record of having gone thru seventeen consecutive seasons with a mark of .300 or better, just making the even 300 this year. Of the player-managers, Tinker of Cincinnati leads, with .317, standing eleventh on the league's list, the others being Evers of Chicago, fourth, with .285; Huggins of St. Louis, forty-first, with the same mark, and Doolin of Philadelphia, eighty-fourth, with .256.

The New Yorks led in club batting, with .275, St. Louis being last.

Dell Paddock, the former Yankee third-baseman, and lately of the Rochester Hustlers, is now a Bison, according to a report from the Buffalo Baseball Club office Saturday afternoon. Manager Clymer purchased Paddock from the Rochester Club.
