National League Batting Averages

NEW YORK, Dec. 1.—Jake Daubert, Erooklyn's star first-baseman, is the National League's champion batsman for the season of 1913. The official batting averages of the league, made public today, show him third on the list, with an average of .350 in 139 games. Of the two men nominally outranking him, however, one. Yingling of Brooklyn, is a pitcher, and tock part in but forty games, while the other, Charles McDonald of Boston, who played in but about half the season's games, is no longer a major leaguer, having been released to Rochester of the International League some time before the close of the season. Yingling, the top man, batted .383, and McDonald .355.
Cravath of Philadelphia is second among the regulars who played in 100 or more games, batting .341, and he also led the league in home runs, with 19 to his credit. The veteran Honus Wagner put to his credit the record of having gone thru seventeen consecutive seasons with a mark of .300 or better, just making the even .300 this year. Of the player-managers, Tinker of Cincinnati leads, with .317, standing eleventh on the league's list, the others being Evers of Chicago, fortieth, with .255; Huggins of St. Louis, forty-first, with the same mark, and Dooin of Philadelphia, eighty-fcurth, with .256.

The New Yorks led in club batting, with .273, St. Louis being last.


