THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL SD-26.

An Act for the relief of Kate Gillman.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Kate Gillman, residing at the city of St. Laurent, in the province of Quebec, wife of Saul Gillman, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the said province, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the twelfth day of June, A.D. 1932, at the said city of Montreal, she then being Kate Lester; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, on the ground of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
