the breafts of all the Members of the Council, His Excellency could fee no use in entering upon Record, opinions that were not coincident; at least, until they should be reconfidered.

The reasons His Excellency said, which induced him to prefer the putting of such different opinions in all future cases upon *fpecial Files*, was this, he could see no good reason why any momentary difference of opinion between the Governor, and the Council, should be open to the Public; which must be the case in regard to the Land-business, if entered upon Record: for, His Excellency said, he could on no Account whatever depart so far from the Orders of his Royal Master, as to allow any of His Majesty's Instructions relative to the granting of the Waste Lands of the Crown, or any of the Proceedings had thereon, so far as the same shall be entered on Record or Placed of Record upon the Ordinary Files, to be kept from the Parties concerned.

His Majefty's Royal Inftructions, in Order to avoid all Caufes of Complaint with refpect to Partiality, ftrictly enjoin (in addition to any Publication that might be made by "Proclamation or otherwife,") that all Inftructions which His Majefty has given, or may hereafter here
