

INTRODUCTION.

The Rules and Forms as promulgated by the Board of County Judges and no marginal references, and a few mistakes crept into the Edition it was printed from the matter prepared by the Judges. To remedy this and to give completeness to the work as a Manual of Division Court Law, and to secure uniformity with the previous part, the Editor has inserted full and appropriate cross references in the margin opposite the different sections, rules and forms.

The reader will notice that the Rules and Forms now published are of the same size and shape similar to that of the former work of the Editor, and the paging runs on continuously throughout. This will be found convenient, and was intended to enable both to be bound together as one volume, which will then give the whole law affecting Division Courts in a convenient and uniform style.

The References to Rules and to Forms which appear in the margin, except when not otherwise specially denoted, are always, to the last Rules and Forms of July, 1869.

To ascertain to what Statute the Sections referred to in the margin allude, long, the reader must turn to the page appended to the reference, which will give the desired information.

The very full and complete Index which completes this addition to the "Division Courts Acts and Rules," has been prepared by Mr. Kains, Barrister, St. Thomas, under the supervision of the Editor. It embraces everything since the former Index, and with that forms a complete key to the whole work.

In conclusion, the Editor desires gratefully to acknowledge the very great assistance he has received from two members of the Board of County Judges in the preparation of the references.
