Favorable Weather in Spring Wheat Country Had Marked Effect on Exchanges.

Wheat—In many respects the action of wheat to-day was disappointing, especially to the over-enthusiastic bulls, who expected too much of the official crop figures in the way of bull influence. There was good buying force at the opening with prices 1½c to 1½c higher on early trades. There was a natural reaction of about ¾c in the fifts hour, under prompt and general profit-taking by holders. Later, additional weaknesses developed, largely because of a decided reaction in prices in all northwest markets. It must be taken into account that the trade and whole country have been posted from day to day by records of crop observers sent out by Chicago houses and for that reason the sharp declines in spring wheat condition indicate late yesterday was no great surprise. Pessibly northwest markets were influenced by somewhat better weather over spring wheat country and absence of anything like serious frost even in the Canadian Northwest.
