Official Announcement Made By Government Removes Any Doubt As to Seriousness of Controversy Respecting Tolls-Vital Interests, Independence or Honor of U.S. Not Affected By the Issue Raised.

LONDON, Sept. 2 .- (Can. Press). -It is officially announced that the British Government will make a formal demand upon the United States Government for arbitration of its claim that the Panama Canal Toll Act, as recently passed by the United State; Congress, violates the Hay-

Nothing definitely is known here beyond the brief official announcement that the formal demand for arbitration would be made, but it is believed that instructions already are en route to the British Embassy at Washington concerning the situation.
