Fifty of Them to Take Charge of Mules for Africa.

A large shipment of mules from the British Horse and Mule Depot (at Lathrop, Missouri, is expected to arrive in Toronto within a few days. About 50 Indian cavalrymen will be in charge of the animals. These men are commonly knewn as "sowars," the Indian nickname by which all cavalry are known in their native country. They are a picturesque class of men and attract much attention. These men are sent to handle the mules during their long sea voyage. The mules and their keepers will remain at the Toronto depot but a short time, and then go, via Montreal, by ship.
