

He also is a transportation expert and was instrumental in organizing the first Canadian pioneer battailon of railway troops. east. The statement read as follows: "We have recently received information that the Germans are sending to France agents whose mission is to cause fires in fanufacturing plants engaged in munition work. For this purpose they are furnished with small incendiary bombs, of which the following is a description: "The bomb is formed in the shape of

is a description:

"The bomb is formed in the shape of apyramid, nine centimetres in height, the larger end measuring 9½ centimetres long by seven centimetres wide, the small end eight centimetres wide, the small end eight centimetres long by 5½ centimetres wide.

"The four sides and the top are made of thin white metal, while the bottom is composed of a thin sheet of card-board covered with a lighht colored varnish, the whole being covered in printed paper. On one side are the words: 'Advance special cooked beef, Firgorificio Argentine, Central Buenon Alres,' with the ipcture of an ox. The same words are on the corresponding side, but without the picture. On the remaining sides are instructions for using the 'suposed' contents, in English, French and Spanish, printed in white on a blue ground.


