MORE WOOL, FEWER PATTERNS ONLY WAY TO REDUCE PRICES

Board of Commerce Told of Reasons For High Cost of Clothing.

TORONTO, Oct. 7.—At the meeting of the board of commerce this morning, Col. W. H. Price, Government counsel, said it was up to the Government to get the manufacturers of clothes in Canada a sufficient supply of wool if clothing prices were ever to be got down.

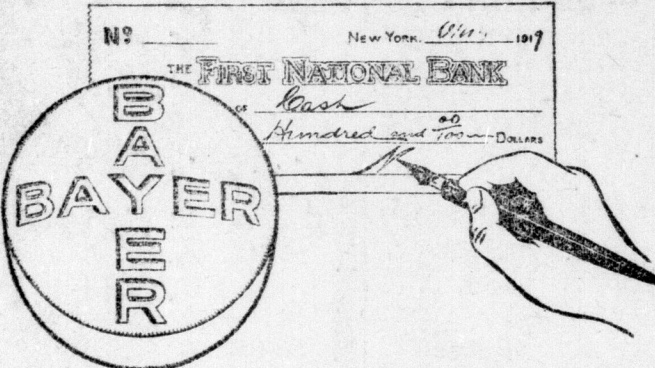
Manager McKinnon of the Robert Simpson Company clothing department said a reduction in the number of patterns would effect a lowering of prices. He agreed that if more wool could be obtained a similar result would follow.

One witness said in explanation of the rise in the price of overalls that materials had gone up in price 300 per cent in the last four years. The Canadian Cotton Company, he said, controlled this material in Canada. This company, he said, had admitted 200 per cent profits in the Ottawa investigation.

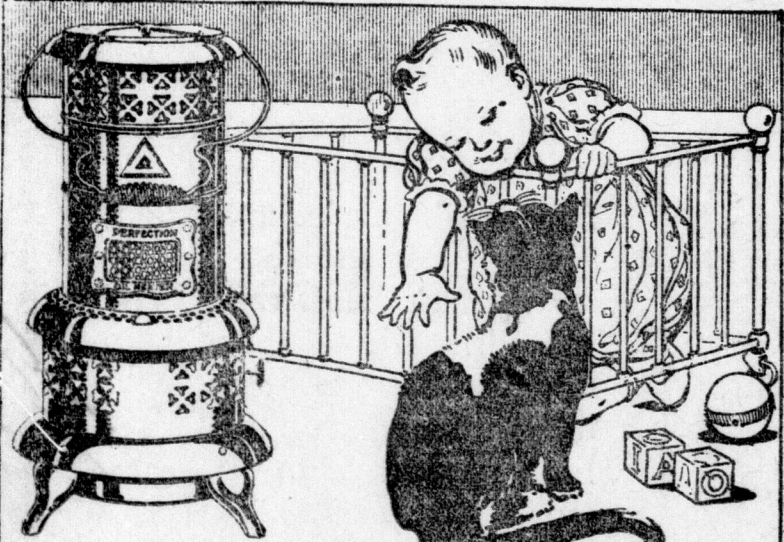

DOHERTY GIVES EXPLANATION OF HIS AMENDMENT

Would Give Provinces Control of Liquor Importation or Manufacture.

REFERENDUM NEEDED

But Dominion Would Hold This For Province On Petition To Do So.

OTTAWA, Oct. 7.—Legislation making it possible for a province to have absolute prohibition either of importation or manufacture of both of spirituous beverages, was introduced in the House of Commons this morning by Hon. C. J. Doherty, minister of justice. Before a province can bring about bone dry conditions under this legislation, however, there must be a plebiscite taken under the authorization of a resolution adopted by the provincial legislature. When this had been done and a plebiscite is duly taken, then whatever the plebiscite provides for will be brought about by proclamation issued in accordance with the procedure provided in the Canada temperance act, of which the bill introduced today is an amendment.

Replying to a series of questions by W. F. MacLean, the minister explained that the present law in Ontario in regard to which a referendum was being taken, did not deal with the question of the importation or manufacture of liquor. The provinces, he said, took the position that they could not deal with that question.

"This," added the minister, referring to the bill he had just introduced, "would be a method whereby in virtue of Dominion legislation becoming operative by the vote of the electorate of a province, importation into that province or manufacture in it would be prohibited."

Special Referendum.
Mr. MacLean—Then Ontario would have to have a special referendum in regard to this question in order to avail itself of this bill.

Mr. Doherty—Upon a petition this Government would hold a referendum in the area of the province on whose behalf the petition was made.

Hon. Charles Maclellan—Does the minister provide for this coming into effect on the majority of the total votes cast, or on a majority of the voters on the list?

Mr. Doherty—It is a provision of the Canada temperance act which I think provides simply for a majority. Another bill introduced by Mr. Doherty amends what is generally known as the Doherty act, a piece of legislation designed to strengthen provincial legislation prohibiting the sale or use of intoxicating liquors. It makes the provisions of that act apply to the manufacture as well as the importation of liquor, and provides that a violator of the act may be tried for an offence either in the province from which the liquor was sent, or the province in which the offence was committed.

On second reading of a bill to amend the criminal code providing that aliens must not have firearms without a permit an amendment by S. W. Jacobs calling for like treatment for all citizens was negatived on a division of 65 to 34.

At the evening session the House considered a resolution by Mr. Guthrie to permit the manufacture and importation of oleomargarine until Aug. 31 next and its sale until March 21, 1921. The opposition of the dairy-men's association was voiced by Donald Sutherland, but the resolution was carried on a division of 22 to 15 and a bill introduced.

BILL TO AMEND THE SCOTT ACT TO BE OFFERED

Amendment To Doherty Temperance Act Also. Proposed.

CO-ORDINATE PROV. ACTS

Measures Adopted by Provinces Would Have Federal Backing.

OTTAWA, Oct. 7.—Two important amendments to existing federal prohibition measures will be up for the consideration of Parliament this week. One is an amendment to the Canada temperance or "Scott" act, and the other to the Doherty act. They are provided for in a bill which Hon. C. J. Doherty will present tomorrow.

The effect of the amendment to the first act is to provide that if any province by plebiscite of the Dominion electors of that province should vote for absolute prohibition of the manufacture or importation of intoxicating liquor that province would be brought under the provisions of the Scott act and a federal proclamation would be issued prohibiting manufacture within the borders of the province and importation into the province.

In effect it contemplates applying the principle of the Scott act as regards manufacture and importation to provinces which vote against manufacture and importation.

The Doherty act as it at present stands prohibits the importation of liquor into a province for purposes which are declared illegal in that province. The amendment prohibits the manufacture of liquor in a province for purposes which are declared illegal in that province. A further amendment is provided making it possible on a man in a province where any violation of the Doherty act has been perpetrated, even though the offender lives in another province; for instance, should liquor be shipped from Montreal to Toronto in violation of the act, then the shipper could be brought to Toronto for trial.

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HAMILTON COUPLE ARE CHARGED WITH A BRUTAL MURDER

Accused Man and Wife Appear Quite Indifferent in Court.

HAMILTON, Oct. 7.—Paul and Annie Kowalski, husband and wife, were placed on trial at the assizes, presided over by Mr. Justice Sutherland, here today, charged with the murder of Ignace Tremliuk last February. The prisoners appeared absolutely indifferent, chatted pleasantly between themselves, and when told by the judge that they had the right to challenge the jurors, replied lightly that they were willing to be tried by any kind of a jury. This brought a sharp rebuke from the judge.

Crown Attorney Agar outlined the case of the prosecution. Tremliuk had been drinking with the prisoners the night before the tragedy. He left a party with them to visit their house. Later his horribly-mutilated body was found 70 feet from the Kowalski home. The police will seek to show the Kowalskis were in destitute circumstances before the crime, and that following the discovery of the body \$700 in \$20 bills similar to those which the dead man had in his possession were found in their house. The police say they found blood on both prisoners, and part of Tremliuk's brains on the kitchen floor.
