The close was nervous at 9c to 10c net higher, with May \$1.33 1/4 to \$1.34, and July \$1.31 1/4 to \$1.32. Oats finished 1/2c to 3/4c to 1/2c up, and provisions varying from 1/2c decline to 2 1/2c advance.

TRADING IS ACTIVE IN MINING STOCKS

Purchases for Investment Account Described as on Unusually Large Scale.

Trading in mining stocks was again brisk yesterday, and, while a number of issues which have had sharp advances lately were disposed to react moderately, there were offsetting gains.

Stocks which figured prominently in the day's business were Peterson Lake, Kirkland Lake, Beaver, Trethewey, Atlas, Teck-Hughes and Adanac. Peterson Lake ran up a total of more than 42,000 shares, holding firm thrust between 24½ and 24¾. Kirkland Lake and Beaver were easier, the former declining 1/4 to 74½, and the latter 1/4 to 65½.

Purchases of Beaver for investment are said to be unusually large. The market as a whole has seen an extraordinary amount of buying of this character recently, one broker yesterday making the assertion that in the past two months more stock had been ordered in the names of individual purchasers than in the twelve months preceding. Naturally, the floating supply of stocks is becoming very small.

Trethewey held at 51 on transactions of more than 100,000 shares. Adanac showed a turnover of 46,000 shares, and sold off 1/4 to 74.

Atlas was a leader in the gold group, 45,500 shares being traded in, the price advancing half a point, to 39½. Kooro rose a point to 19½, and Teck-Hughes half a point to 18. Hollinger was steady at \$6.85. Petrol Oil advanced four points, to 48.
