Society has not been materially lessened. Although the long-continued monetary depression, and the withdrawal of some old friends, and other adverse circumstances might naturally be supposed to affect the Income of your Society, the Managers have much pleasure in stating, that such is not the fact to any great extent. For these and other mercies they give their unfeigned thanks to the Giver of all good.

The Managers feel that their grateful acknowledgments are due to their distinguished Lady Patroness, Her Excellency Lady Head, for the warm interest which she has taken in the Institution, and the valuable support and countenance afforded it by her upon all occasions, more especially at the Christmas Festival of last year.
