MURDER AND SUICIDE

Albany, N. Y., Sept. 14.—What appears to the authorities of Albany as a murder and suicide occurred early this morning on the Troy road, just outside of Albany. The dead body of Michael J. O'Leary, aged about 45, a saloon keeper of Albany, was found lying on the floor of the kitchen in the home of W. A. Wilkinson, his brother-inlaw. Nearby in a chair was the dead body of Mirs, O'Leary. Both received bullet wounds in the head. The police believe that following a quarrel, O'Leary's hody was a 32 calibre revolver, Coroner Baxter, of Watervelt, was calked. Mr. and Mrs. O'Leary were married about a year ago.
