Dear Sir:-

In reply to your letter of the 22nd instant, I have to inform you that the Rev. James Taylor was appointed by the Church authorities to the principalship of Emmanuel College, an Indian Boarding School at Prince Albert, in January, 1900.

Mr. Taylor's salary was paid by either the Church authorities or from per capita grant up to and including the month of June, 1908. At that time the institution was closed, and the Department assumed the liabilities. From the months of June to September inclusive, the Department did not pay a per capita grant, but allowed the Rev. Mr. Taylor a salary of \$75. per month, while the business of the school was being wound up and the harvest gathered.
