Whereas: In justice to them and protection to ourselves from abusers of their statutory privileges, be it

Acsolved: That we petition the president of the United States of America, to deeming it vital to the interests of the country at this time, that the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors be prohibited, do respectfully petition you to use the power vested in you as President of the United States of America, to declare their manufacture and sale prohibited for the period of the war, and be it further
