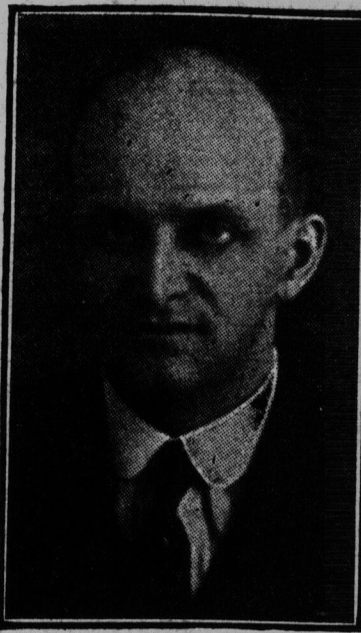

JULY PAYMENTS EXCEED JUNE'S

City Accounts Paid in Last Month Are Nearly \$195,000

Much of Increase is the \$40,000 Paid N. B. Electric Power Commission.

The payments made by the city chamberlain for July, 1925, amounted to nearly \$195,000 and were \$45,000 in excess of those for the preceding month of June which amounted to \$149,471.71. The increase is very largely accounted for by the payment of \$40,000 to the New Brunswick Electric Power Commission, in settlement of its account for hydro current supplied to the Civic Power Commission for the year which ended April 30, 1925. This sum is to be paid back to the city by the Civic Commission from receipts. During the month \$40,000 was paid over to the board of school trustees and \$7,380.64 to the General Public Hospital.

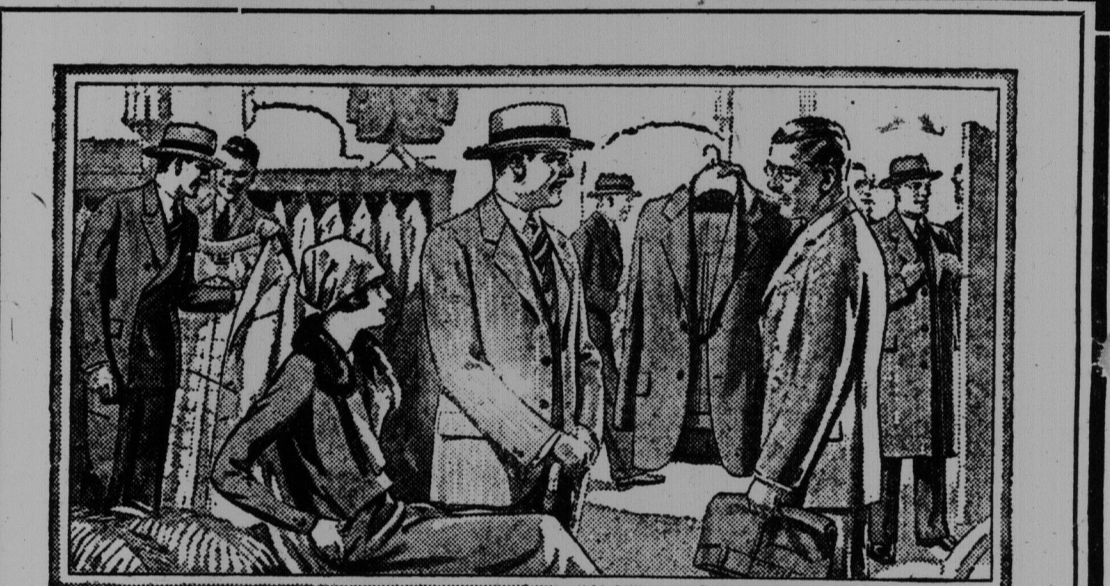
