**Purchase Flashes Home First Again.**  
15,000 See Hildreth Star Outfit Extraordinary in Stuyvesant Handicap at Jamaica.

**New York, June 21.**—Samuel C. Hildreth's Purchase proved his racing quality beyond cavil yesterday, and in the opinion of a majority of the 15,000 persons at Jamaica qualified as a real rival of Commander Ross' champion three-year-old, Sir Barton. Carefully nursed through the early part of the season, while Sir Barton was making the turf world ring with his praises, Purchase made his third appearance in the Stuyvesant Handicap for three-year-olds and, as in his two previous outings under colors, he won with ease.

**No easy task was set the new star in the turf world, which gained the respect of the experts by his victory over Billy Kelly in the Southampton Handicap on the morning of the meeting.**

**With Loftus in the saddle, Purchase performed his task in a workmanlike manner, and though his margin of victory was but half a length he was being eased at the finish and undoubtedly could have scored by a far greater margin.**

**The time of 1:28.43 constituted a track mark, as the Stuyvesant was the first race at a mile ever held on the track.**

**Sir Barton And Purchase May Race.**  
Crack Three-Year-Olds to Meet; Should Prove Biggest Betting Race of Recent Years.

**New York, June 21.**—There is another crack three-year-old to meet; should prove biggest betting race of recent years.

**He has won the Kentucky Derby, the Preakness, the Withers and the Belmont. The most notable victory of Purchase was scored yesterday in the Stuyvesant Handicap at Jamaica.**

**In a match race between Sir Barton and Purchase, Loftus would ride the Ross horse. Commander Ross has second call on his services.**

**John E. Madden, who bred Sir Barton, also bred Purchase. The master of the Hamburg Place would therefore have to remain neutral in the event of the two star three-year-olds measuring strides.**

**Sir Barton would unquestionably be made favorite over Hildreth's colt. But there are some shrewd judges of horse-flesh who would take the Purchase end, if Hildreth could find a jockey who would not be hopelessly outgeneraled by Loftus.**

**HAGEN SEEKING BRITISH TITLE.**

## GENERAL TURNER VERY DEFINITE ON DISTURBANCES

**Special Order of The Day To Troops in England.**  
Everyone Present and Not Helping Held Blameworthy—Holds Out no Hope for Amnesty at Conclusion of Peace.

**London, June 22.**—Four reports of the coal commission which had been considering nationalization of British mines have been published. The main report is signed by Justice Sir John Sankey. It also recommends immediate legislation for acquisition of mines, royalties for the state and for owners to receive just compensation. It also recommends the immediate application of local administration of mines through local district and national mining councils and legislation for acquiring mines after the plan has been worked for three years with just compensation for owners. It is recommended that coal control be continued for three years.

**The report of the miners generally agrees with that of Justice Sankey, but objects to provisions that would require the men to sign a contract not to combine to cease work until a question in dispute has been referred to arbitration.**

**This report denied that the diminished output of coal is the fault of the men, and demands an immediate inquiry. The miners' union similarly requested a hearing on the subject. The three representatives of the miners, Messrs. Hodges, Milne and Smith, object to compensation being given, apart from allowances where the small royalty owners are deprived of their livelihoods.**

**The owners' report figures argue that any form of nationalization would be detrimental to the development of the industry and the economic life of the country. It says no action so vitally affecting the whole of the country should be taken without referring the question to the community.**

**The report recommends the establishment of a department of mines which would be assisted by a system of councils, similar to those recommended by the miners. With a view to removing the difficulties arising from royalties this report proposes that the state acquire ownership of the coal subject to the continuance of existing leases for at least thirty years.**

**A German rear-admiral and most of the German fleet are now in custody aboard British ships. Some boats from the ships refused to stop when ordered and were fired upon. A small number of Germans were killed or wounded.**
