Daily Hints For the Cook

BAKED ASPARAGUS OMELET Butter a baking dish and put in it a layer of cooked asparagus tips. Beat the yolk of four eggs until light, season with salt and pepper, and four tablespoons of hot water, fold in the stiffly beaten whites, pour the mixture over the asparagus and bake in a quick oven until the eggs are set. Serve immediately from the dish in which it is cooked. Canned asparagus tips may be used.

CANADIAN GINGERBREAD One cup of butter, 2 of molasses, 5 of flour, 3 eggs, 1 nutmeg, 1 teaspoon of ginger, 1 of soda, 1 teaspoon of cream or very rich milk, 1 tablespoon of cinnamon, 1 pound of currants. Beat the butter to a cream, add the sugar, molasses and spice, next the eggs well beaten, then the cream or milk in which the soda has been dissolved, next the flour, and last the currants. Mix in order given, as much of the flour depends on how it is mixed. This will make three sheets. Bake in a moderately quick oven 25 minutes.


