DINGHY TRIALS TO BE MADE HERE

Covey Makes Olympic Announcements on Return from Montreal.

Maritime Olympic dinghy trials will be held here early in June and the best skipper will go to Montreal to compete against skippers from Montreal and Toronto on June 6 for the honor of being selected to represent Canada at the Pacific games. This was announced here this morning by A. W. Covey on his return from Montreal where he attended a meeting of the Canadian Olympic committee on Saturday.

"Dinghy trials will be held probably early in June at Toronto and Montreal," he said, "to allow these centres to select a skipper and the three men will convene at Montreal. The Maritime representative will not be required to take his boat with him as a standard boat will be used at Montreal. He will sail a different dinghy on each three days of the trial in order to test his knowledge of handling and sailing the craft. This should prove of great interest particularly to Halifax and St. John sports and from what I have seen of sailing around here, I look forward with confidence to the outcome of the Montreal finale."

Other selections confirmed were Hilton Belyea of St. John as Canada's representative at the rowing classics and Dave Johnson, now studying at Oxford, for the 40 yard event. J. Howard Crocker will be unable to make the trip as general manager and P. J. Mulqueen of Toronto, was appointed in his stead. Mr. Covey said that the Quebec Government made a grant of \$3,000 to the Olympic fund and that the Olympic committee would ask for an additional grant of 10,000 from the Federal Government.

The new plant will not be for the purpose of handling hardwood from the Randolph & Baker limits on the upper St. John river which they recently purchased, but it is proposed to ship hardwood, after it has been cut at various small mills, to St. Leonard and there complete the manufacture. Of course the Randolph & Baker limits hardwood supply will go there with the rest. How soon an actual start will be made at St. Leonard on construction of the proposed plant there has not been decided so far as can be learned.
