DR. BAILEY LECTURES BEFORE N. H. SOCIETY

DLIUNL N. II. JUUILII

Dr. L. W. Bailey, of Fredericton, gave an instructive lecture last night to an appreciative audience in the rooms of the Natural History Society. The subject was: Echinoderms, or Starfishes and Their Renatives.

The lecturer pointed out the various places where the starfish may be found, which include Duck Cove and other logalities near St. John. This animal is more abundant in shallow than in deep water, especially on or near oyster beds. It is very voracious and causes great damage to the oyster industry. Its general appearance was described, as well as its skeleton, the water vascular system as an agency enabling it to crawl, its digestive system and mode of eating. In eating an oyster the starfish in arching its body over its victim, turns its stomach inside out and around the soft body of the nollusc, and after dige-ting it withdraws the stomach again. Other interesting facts about the starfish were given, such as its power to recover after mutilation, the systems of circulation and respiration and the nervous system.
