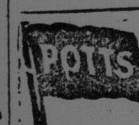

An added toast was given by Mayor Schofield to the memory of those who died at the front. The assembly broke up with the singing of Aud Lang Syne and three cheers for the navy, given with right goodwill. The officers returned the compliment with three cheers for the people of St. John.
