Grand Lodge was opened in Smyle form, at 1 o'clock, afternoon, in the Templar Hall, and from thence the Brethren marched in procession, headed by the band, to the site of the proposed church.

The front of the procession having reached the site, a halt-was made, and the ranks opened out and faced inwards, when the Grand Master, supported by the Grand Officers, passed through to the North-east corner, where a platform had been erected for their convenience. It had been arranged that the Church of England Service should take place first, and accordingly, as soon as the Grand Master had been received and welcomed, the proceedings were commenced by Bro. the Rev. Canon Worrell, M. A., Incumbent of the Church, who conducted the portion of the ceremony pertaining to the Church of England.

W. Bro. the Rev. W. J. MacKenzie, Acting Grand Chaplain, then offered up a suitable prayer, and the Grand Secretary read the following scroll:—

By the favor of Almighty God, on the Thirteenth day of June, 1888, Era of Masonry, 5888,

And in the Forty-seventh year of the reign of our Most Gracious Sovereign,

By the Grace of God Empress of India, and Queen of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the Dominion of Canada.
