Cholera from Rags.

INVESTIGATING THE COMPLAINST OF PAPER STOCK IMPORTERS

NEW YORK, May 20. - There was a second meeting of the Chamber of Commerce committee which is inquiring into the complaints of importers of rags. B. F. Einstein, a lawyer representing De Castro & Co., submitted a long statement giving the details of the case of the bark Fillpo, which came here from the Mediterranean last June with a from the Mediterranean last June with a cargo of rags consigned to De Castro & Co., who were compelled to have her cargo disinfected notwithstanding the consular certificate that the rags had been gathered and shipped from a district free from cholera or other contagious diseases.

Mr. Einstein said that his clients were willing to stand by the resolution which the chamber of commerce passed last October, requiring that cargoes of rags from infected ports should be disinfected, but that those

chamber of commerce passed last October, requiring that cargoes of rags from infected ports should be disinfected, but that those with consular certification as from non-infected places, should be admitted without disinfection.

Mr. McClintook, of Lockwood & McClintock, rag importers, opposed the disinfection of non-infected rags, not so much from the high cost, as on principle. New York and Boston were the only ports, he said, insisting on this disinfection, and importers in other cities had the advantage of being able to bring in rags without this additional expense. If disinfection was to be required on cargoes with a clean bill of health it should be enforced at every other port, he urged, so that other ports will not have an advantage over New York. Mr. McClintock further claimed that the disinfection by superheated steam was not a success, but was utterly inefficient and unreliable. He said that importers of paper stock had a greater interest than the general public in bringing in only clean rags, for if the cholers was to originate in a paper mill it would not only result in the financial ruin of the
