SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, may be homesteaded by any person, who is the sole head of a family, or who is over 18 years of age, to the say of one-quarter section of 160 acres, extent or more. Application for a homestead may be made in person by the applicant, at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency, for the district in which the land is situated. Duties.—(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years. (2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement. (3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention. Regulations of the Public Health Act

42. No household in whose dwelling there occurs any case of scarlet fever, diphtheria, small-pox, cholera, or typhoid fever, shall permit any person suffering from any such disease, or any clothing or other property to be removed from the house without the consent of the Local Board of the district, or of the sanitary officer or attending physician, who shall prescribe the conditions of removal. 43. No person affected with any of the diseases in the last section named, and no person having access to any person affected with any of the said diseases shall mingle with the general public until such sanitary precautions as may be prescribed by the Local Board or attending physician, shall have been complied with. 44. Persons recovering from small-pox, scarlet fever, diphtheria, cholera or typhoid fever, and nurses who have been in attendance on any person suffering from any such disease, shall not leave the premises until they have received from the attending Physician, Local Board or sanitary officer, a certificate that they have taken such precautions as to their persons, clothing, and all other things which they purpose bringing from the premises, as are necessary to prevent the spread of infection to other persons with whom they may come in contact, and no such person shall expose himself in any public place, shop, street, inn or public conveyance, without having first adopted such precautions. 56. Whenever any house owner shall know that any person within his family has small-pox, scarlet fever, or any other disease dangerous to the public health, he shall immediately give notice thereof to the health officer of the Local Board of Health for the Municipality, city or town in which he resides. For not taking such precautions and concealing the existence of a contagious disease a fine of FORTY DOLLARS can be imposed. Ignorance of the nature of the disease is no excuse as a physician must be called when there is any doubt. C. C. ALEXANDER, M. D. Chairman Board of Health

A Remarkable Document

One of the most remarkable monuments in the world is that which marks the grave of Mr. Chester Bebel, of Ohio. This monument is in all appearance a cartoon in stone in favor of Christianity, but it was intended by the man whose grave it marks as an infidel monument. During his lifetime Bebel declared that he "was driven to believe that religion was pervervation and the Bible a myth. When stricken by disease his crest of hate did not fail him, and the monument which he designed to mark his resting-place is unique in its conception. It is a life-size statue of himself in bronze. One hand holds aloft a scroll on which is inscribed "Universal Mental Liberty," and one foot treads upon the Holy Writ, which is labelled "Superstition." Those who are not familiar with the story of the monument often look upon it as a veritable silent sermon. "Universal mental liberty" is surely the aim of Christianity, while the stamping out of superstition is one of the tenets of our religion. In this remarkable gravestone we have but another example of how the efforts of the Christian's enemy are often turned to good account on the side of religion.
